## **Second Corinthians** Sunday, January 10, 2016

- 2. Share together about what you know and remember about the background and set up for Paul's letters to the Corinthians? When and why does he write this second letter?
- 3. The church at Corinth is a MESS! Specifically, the Corinthian Christians are enamored with so called "super apostles." Read 2 Corinthians 11:1-20. What does Paul say about these "super apostles"?
- **4.** What do we mean when we call the Gospel a "Way"? What do we mean we call the Gospel "counterintuitive"? What do we mean when we call the Gospel "countercultural"?
- **5.** Read 2 Corinthians 4:16 -5:17. How do you see in yourself a natural bent to live for/by and judge by sight? What does it practically mean to

"walk by faith" not by sight? Why is that countercultural and counterintuitive?

- 6. Read 2 Corinthians 1:3-11. How do you see in yourself a natural bent to avoid and eliminate "affliction" from your life? What are examples of affliction? What does it practically mean to embrace our affliction? What does affliction make us do in verse 9? Why is that countercultural and counterintuitive?
- 7. Read 2 Corinthians 11:30-12:10. How do you see in yourself a natural bent to hide or despise your weaknesses? What does Paul say our weaknesses are for in 12:9-10? What does it practically look like to delight in our weaknesses? Why is that countercultural and counterintuitive?

Household/Family Focus: for discussion in your household

Discuss how these 3 Gospel principles: 1) walking by faith not by sight, 2) comfort in affliction, and 3) strength through weakness are all countercultural and counterintuitive?
