- 3. When you're not drawing your joy from the well of Jesus' resurrection, what worldly wells are you drawing joy from?

4. Jesus teaches in John 16 that, like in childbirth, resurrection joy is birthed through and transforms sorrows! How is this true in Jesus' experience? How is this true in the first disciple's experience? How have you personally experienced this truth in your life?

5. Read 1 Peter 1:3-9. How does this passage connect to and relate to John 16?

6. Can you recall (without looking) the 3 reasons why resurrection joy transforms our sorrows and is invincible/indestructible?

7. How do we practically go to "the well of resurrection joy" instead of all the empty and dry wells the world promises, but which never satisfy?
