#### **DISCUSS** (use some of these questions to process God's Word together)

- 1. Read John 16:23-32 together as a group. How did you "come under" God's Word and the message this week? How did this text/message speak to you?
- 2. The setting of this teaching is critical for our understanding! Where and when does Jesus speak these words? What is significant about these words? How does the setting shape how we hear and understand these words?
- 3. Is Jesus giving us a "name it and claim it" promise in John 16:23 -27?

  Or is He speaking of the way of prayer opened by His death and resurrection as the One Mediator between God and humankind?

  What's difference between those two? How are we to understand these verses?

- 4. Where in this text do we see the grace and patience of Jesus toward His bumbling, fumbling, failing disciples? How does this encourage us who also are bumbling, fumbling, failing followers of Jesus?
- 5. In John 16:33 why does Jesus say He speaks these words? Does that work? How do Jesus' words give the thing that Jesus promises? Explore the mechanics of this.
- 6. What does it mean to "take heart"? What are we instructed to "take heart" in? How do we do that? How can you AMPLIFY the Gospel and REDUCE the world's noise? How will you do that this week?

## PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Share your own needs and troubles.
- TAKE HEART by praying for one another in light of the Gospel truths in John 16.
