



Off with the Old Self Ephesians 4:17-24 Sunday, February 2, 2020

Connecting Together

In Ephesians we are talking about walking (living) with and in Christ. So how has your relationship with Christ impacted this week of your life? (Pair off in twos to discuss and then share what you learned from the other person in your pair.)

Digging into God's Word & the Message Together

- Read Ephesians 4:17-24 together again as group. How did you come under God's Word in the text and message this week? How did God speak to you? What did you learn or what were you reminded of in this study?
- 2. In Ephesians 4:17-19, how did Paul's description of life apart from God strike you? How does remembering Ephesians 2:1-4 while reading Ephesians 4:17-19 keep us from an US vs. THEM self righteousness and why is that important?

- 3. Can you identify some examples/instances in our culture or in people around you, where you see the truth of Paul's description in Ephesians 4:17-19? What should be our response to people who are living their lives apart from God? What was God's response to us?
- 4. What is an area in your life where you wander back into and dabble in your old self, old lifestyle, and old desires? Why do you think that is? What would it mean for you to put that OFF? How would you do that?
- 5. Your Growth Group as a Family: Paul's call to righteousness and holiness follows quickly the call to unity in Ephesians 4. So how do our sinful behaviors impact our connection to and intimacy with one another in the family of God, the church?
- 6. Your Growth Group as a Servant/Missionary: True righteousness and self righteousness are two different things. What's the difference? Why does self-righteousness separate us from those who don't know Christ? Why must true righteousness move us toward those who don't know Christ? In Ephesians 4:24, how can we tell that true righteousness is not something we earn, but something we're given and then practice?
