1.	We only honor as we honor (v. 23)		
2.	We only and by believing the Son. (v. 24)		
3.	All who believe the Son are now being raised from spiritual to spiritual by the voice of the Son. (v. 25)		
4.	All will one day be raised to eternal or eternal by the voice of the Son. (v. 28)		
NEXT STEPS:			
If you identify as a follower of Jesus, in light of the truths of John 5, find some focused time this week to honor the Son for who He is and the life He gives.			
If you don't yet identify as a follower of Jesus, take some time this week to consider the radical claims of Jesus and ponder your own response to those claims. What is keeping you from believing Jesus and His radical claims?

5. While Jesus speaks generally about doing the work of God, Jesus specifically mentions two types of work He does. What two "works" does He mention? And which one of the two is something only Jesus does? Why?

6. Why are these radical claims of Jesus so challenging to believe today and always?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Use John 5 as a springboard and fuel for your prayers together, spend some time honoring and worshiping the Son for who He is and His work.
- Share and pray for one another's needs.
