Growth Group Understanding Questions

From Whom, To Whom & Why? Getting Grace: A Study of Galatians Galatians 1:1-5 February 10, 2007

- 1. Read Galatians 1:1-5 and compare it with 2 or 3 other opening paragraphs from Paul's letters. What's similar and what's different? What did you hear from the message that might explain this?
- 2. Read the entire book of Galatians and describe what you see? Is it a mishmash of topics or is there a progressive argument? What is the tone? Why might Paul write this way?
- 3. What is the primary purpose of Paul's letter to the Galatians and how is this important issue foreshadowed in the opening paragraph?
- 4. What references do you see in this opening paragraph to Paul's own authority and how does this issue relate to the larger primary purpose of the letter? To put it another way, why does Paul seem to defend his authority?

5. What 3 or 4 dimensions of the Gospel do we see here in this opening paragraph? Why are these revolutionary and universe changing?
