What's Your Story? Getting Grace: A Study of Galatians Galatians 1:11-24 February 24, 2008

- 1. Explain the false rumor about Paul that Paul's opponents were quite likely circulating through the Galatian churches: *Paul is a second rate Apostle with a second-hand Gospel.* As you read Galatians 1:11-24 again, where do you see Paul confronting and trying to connect this false rumor?
- 2. Ponder the phrase in 1:11, "the gospel which was preached to me is not according to man." What does this mean? What kinds of "gospels" do men invent? What kinds of gospel appeal to men?
- 3. In 1:13-14, what does Paul say were the two things that defined his life before and apart from Christ? How were these two related?
- 4. What do you notice about the subjects of the sentences/phrases in 1:13-14 compared to the subjects of the sentences/phrases in 1:15-16A? Why is this change significant and what does it indicate?

5. Paul describes his transformational Gospel encounter as 4 dimensional. What are those 4 dimensions? Can you identify these same dimensions in your own life?

- 1. What was new and most challenging in the text/message this week and why?
- 2. What's your story? Apart from your encounter with Christ, what have been the 3 or 4 big events that have affected and shaped your life?
- 3. Describe 1) your life before Christ, 2) your conversion to Christ, 3) your changed life after Christ. Why is it valuable to personally reflect on your story? Why is valuable to tell your story to others?
- 4. What do we mean when we say the Gospel is "REVELATIONAL"? How does the Gospel stand in contrast with every other world religion?

5. What do we mean when we say the Gospel is "MISSIONAL"? Must our mission look like Paul's? What are some things that God has called you to and/or some places God has sent you to? How does 1:24 illustrate what these calling and sendings are supposed to accomplish?
