Before jumping into the following questions, please read Luke 19:1-27 again to get reoriented to God's Word and this week's message.

1. Why was Zacchaeus a social and religious "outsider" that no one expected would be seeking Jesus?

2. What are some of the ways that Jesus connects with, cares for and engages Zacchaeus? Are these practical and relevant ways that we can connect with, care for and engage lost people today?

3. The mission of Jesus is also our mission as His church. How does Jesus define that vision at the end of His Zacchaeus encounter?

4. Our NEXT vision is about recommitting to the mission of Jesus in a concrete and practical way to reach more lost people in SLO County. How does our NEXT vision actually aim to engage lost people?

5. Jesus rolls right from the encounter with Zacchaeus into His "parable of the talents." How does this parable relate to the point Jesus made as He engaged Zacchaeus?

6. Jesus' parable invites us to invest the resources He's entrusted to our care in His kingdom work, even as Zacchaeus begins to do. How does your giving compare to other financial investments you make on a recurring basis? (cell phone bill, mortgage payment, gym membership, entertainment)?
