Studying God's Word Together

- 1. As a group together, see if you can build and tell the history of Israel beginning at Abraham to the end of the book of Joshua.
- 2. Draw some parallels between Joshua and Jesus. How are they similar and how the are different? How does Jesus supersede Joshua?
- 3. In Joshua 6, what "ridiculous" things does God command His people to believe and do? Where does God's Word seem strange to us and others? What are some of the seemingly "ridiculous" things we are called to do?
- 4. Read Joshua 24:14-28 together as a group. What does Joshua's challenge to this generation of God's people? How does this compare with the challenge of Moses in Deuteronomy 30:15-20, which we looked at last week?

6. The Promised Land was Israel's inheritance. Read 1 Peter 1:3-9. What do these verses say about our inheritance?

7. After the conquest, God gave His people "rest." Read Hebrews 3:12-11. According to Hebrews 3:19, why wasn't the previous generation able to enter God's "rest"? What does 4:9-11 tell us and how does that sound to you?

8. The covenant made between the people in Joshua 24:25 is one the many covenants in the Bible after which we patterned of our GraceSLO Covenant. What is the purpose and function of the Joshua 24 covenant? How about our GraceSLO Covenant? (We urge you to print our GraceSLO Covenant from the website and read it out loud together as a group.)
