As he moves his Gospel account into the final day of Jesus's life, John recounts how Jesus willingly endured injustice and evil from the religious leaders. We look deep into this account of hatred against Jesus to see why it happened and what that means for us today.

CONNECT (ask this question to check-in with your group)

Are you doing anything to spiritually prepare for Easter and celebrating the cross and resurrection?

DISCUSS (use some of these questions to process God's Word together)

- 1. Read the whole of John 18:1-14; 19–24 together as a group. How did you "come under" God's Word and the message this week? How did God speak to you in the text/message?
- 2. If Jesus really is God, then he is facing here the worst injustice in human history. How does this text (and other portions of Scripture) help us see how God relates to the injustice we face and create in our lives and world?
- 3. How is v.11 the driving force behind the "why" of Jesus enduring all this suffering and injustice?

- 4. How is v.14 the Gospel in miniature? Look back at John 11:45–53 for some helpful context.
- 5. Look at Jesus's teaching in Matthew 5:38–48. This teaching sounds impossible, yet John 18 shows Jesus living up to his own standards. How is Jesus doing this in John 18, and how can it be an example for us?
- 6. Jesus submits to the Father's will and sees God's faithfulness on the other side of obedience. Share a time you had to trust God in a dark season and saw God be faithful to you through it.

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Pray for comfort for those facing injustice in our world. Pray for God to empower Christians to intervene wherever we can.
- Praise Jesus for his willingness to suffer for us
- Confess ways you are "striking" Jesus and resisting him as Lord.
- Share and pray for one another's needs.
