



- 2. Have you ever noticed or thought about the reality that the Risen Jesus still has scars? On Friday, when Jesus was dying, what did those wounds mean to the disciples? What do those scars mean to you now?
- 3. What is "shalom"? Why did the disciples need to hear that greeting from Jesus? How does the resurrection accomplish real "shalom"?

- 4. To what degree does your life reflect the new peace you have in Jesus?
- 5. Where in John 20 does Jesus talk about our new family? Why is this a word of grace to these disciples?
- 6. How is your growth group doing "living together" as a new family? How can you lean into this "new family" truth even more this Spring quarter?
- 7. We, the followers of Jesus, are a SENT people. What does that mean and where is this truth taught in John 20? What are some of the many ways our lives can reflect this truth? How does your life reflect this truth?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- In light of John 20, pray that your group might more fully internalize and believe that we have a new peace, a new family, and a new mission.
- Share and pray for one another's needs.
