- 5. We were made for a Faithful Savior, a Forever Life, a Joyful Feast and and a Unshakeable Kingdom. Do you agree or disagree with that statement? What evidence do you have to support your perspective?
- 6. Your Growth Group as a Family: In anticipation of the joyful feast that's coming, plan and pull off a virtual feast to share as a Growth Group. Everyone make their favorite meal. Then gather online and share why it's you favorite meal and feast together online!

7. Your Growth Group as a Servant/Missionary: These Resurrection Promises are meant to be shared. Where do you see that in the text of Psalm 22.
