 Take time to read the whole book of James together. There's a lot covered in this short book. What jumped out at you this time through or in the message?

2. Read 1:19-25. This text highlights a major concern for James, the author. What is this concern and what's the illustration he uses to make his point?

3. Read James 2:14-26 again and then Romans 3:28. This apparent contradiction is explained by the fact that James and Paul are combatting two separate doctrinal errors. What is Paul combatting? What is James combatting? Which error do you think is the biggest danger in your own life today? In the church today?

4. As you read the book of James, where did you notice James speaking of our deep, unfixable sin?

5. James calls us to living faith which produces good works. He also reminds us of the deep sin within. But does he point us to the Gospel? After all, there's hardly a mention of the name of Christ and no clear reference to the work of Christ. Where does the essence of the Gospel shine in the book of James?

The world says exalt yourself. Where do you see that happening in popular culture? How do WE do that? The Bible says "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." Read James 4:6-10 and discuss what humility before God actually looks like.
