## CONNECT (ask these questions to check-in with your group)

Let's stay in the metaphor and share with one another what our race of faith looked like and felt like this week.

DISCUSS (use some of these questions to process God's Word together)

1. Read the whole of Hebrews 12 together as a group. How did you "come under" God's Word and the message this week? What did you learn? What were the takeaways?
2. As has been the case throughout the book of Hebrews there's a couple of warning verses in Hebrews 12:12-29. What are they and what is the author's purpose in the warnings? What is he trying to encourage in us and these Christians to whom he writes?
3. What does it PRACTICALLY look like to strive for peace and holiness as we run our race of faith? Talk about this! Share an example from your own life of you or someone else striving for peace or holiness.
4. We've said that everyone's race of faith is unique and different, but this week we also saw that we run the race of faith with others. How can both those things be true? Are you more apt to run your race of faith solo or with others? What are ways we can help one another finish? How serious are we about helping one another finish?
5. Like so much of the Bible, the finish line description in Hebrews 12:18-29 requires contemplation. It appears at first obscure and vague. Is the finish line something that motivates you in your race of faith? Why or why not? Could it motivate you if you contemplated it more?

## PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Pray for another as you run your race of faith together fixing your eyes on Jesus and the finish line!
