Habakkuk's dialogue with God contains wonderfully relevant truths for God's people struggling with inexplicable circumstances in every age . . .

Chapter 1: Be Careful What You Ask For! (6:8)

Habakkuk asks God the questions we all ask . . .

- 1. HOW LONG, Lord? (1:2)
- 2. WHERE ARE YOU, Lord? (1:2)
- 3. WHY, Lord? (1:3)
- Sometimes God acts in UNEXPECTED ways. (1:5-11)
- Sometimes it seems to us like God's ACTIONS don't line up with His CHARACTER. (1:12-17)

Chapter 2: The Righteous Shall Live by Faith

Faith is how we are declared righteous and live . . .

- even when we don't UNDERSTAND what God is doing.
- even when we don't LIKE what God is doing.

Chapter 3: A Prayer of Trust

- 1. SUBMIT to God's PURPOSES. (3:1-2)
- 2. PLEAD for God's MERCY. (3:2)
- 3. REMEMBER God's FAITHULNESS. (3:15)
- 4. Take JOY in the God of your SALVATION. (3:16-19)

Without looking at the outline, where does he submit to God's purposes, plead for God's mercy, remember God's faithfulness and take joy in the God of his salvation? Do you think this is practical and possible in the circumstances that we face and in light of the Gospel?
- 6. How is the cross the ultimate example of God "in wrath remembering mercy"?
