CONNECT (ask these questions to check-in with your group)

DISCUSS (use some of these questions to process God's Word together)

- 1. Read Numbers 21:4-9 and John 3:14-16 together as a group. How did you "come under" God's Word in the text/message this week? What was new, fresh or challenging?
- 2. What are the parallels between the bronze snake lifted up in Numbers 21 and Jesus in John 3? How is Jesus God's snake and how is He lifted up?
- 3. Do you think most people won't/don't look to Jesus for salvation because they're too unaware of their sin OR because they're too

overwhelmed by their sin? In other words, do they not see their need for Jesus OR they don't believe Jesus can save?

- 4. Why is God's salvation strange and what does that strangeness require from us?
- 5. When we don't look to Jesus for salvation, satisfaction, and life, we look to other things because we always look to something. What personal and worldly cures are people looking to today?
- 6. Growth Group as Family: What do YOU look to for salvation, satisfaction, and life when you look away from Jesus? How does your Growth Group help you fix your eyes on Jesus? How can your group help you more?
- 7. Growth Group as Servant/Missionary: Who comes to your mind today as a person who needs Jesus, but is looking to other personal and worldly cures? How can you love, serve, and/or engage them in the next week or month?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Pray for those suffering through this Covid-19 pandemic and pray for the continuing recovery.
- Use your prayer time to again "fix your eyes on Jesus" together. Pray for one another based on how you've shared.
- Pray for one another's needs and those who need Jesus.
