1. How did you "come under" God's Word in the text and message this week? Did anything jump out at you or stick with you from the message?

4. Read Zephaniah 3:9-20. Who does God's salvation include in verses 9-20? What are some of the blessings of God's salvation that are described?

5. In Zephaniah, the contrast between God's wrath and God's rejoicing could not be greater. What's the missing puzzle piece of Zephaniah? In other words, HOW does God move from wrath toward us to rejoicing over us? Read Romans 3:21-26.

2. Read Zephaniah 1:1-7. Zephaniah, like many of the prophets, brings the coming judgment of God into sharp and bold focus. What are some of the reasons this reality is far from our daily lives? In other words, why don't we think of God's judgment?

3. Read Zephaniah 2:1-3 and share how it proves this statement: "We must be saved FROM God BY God." Have you ever thought of your salvation in those terms before? Does that make sense to you?

Seek the Lord together as you marinate in the Gospel and give thanks for the blessings of the Gospel and the joy that's coming. Pray that these realities might be more real to your heart.
