2. ESCAPING God's Wrath

- God has PROVIDED a salvation.
- JESUS CHRIST is our salvation.

He DIED for us. (The JUDGE was JUDGED!)

So that we might LIVE TOGETHER with Him. (Instead of being JUDGED by Him.)

• We will OBTAIN this salvation, because God has PURPOSED it.

3. LIVING IN LIGHT of God's Wrath

Because of what God has done for us in Christ, we are now children of the light and day. Therefore . . .

- Let us live AWAKE and SOBER in readiness.
- Let us ARMOR UP with the Gospel!
- Let us ENCOURAGE and BUILD UP one another.

4. Paul uses two similes to describe the coming of the Lord. What are these similes and what do each uniquely convey?

- 5. What does Paul's beautiful Gospel climax in 5:9-10 do to/in you? What does Paul say is the means of the Gospel? What does Paul say is the end of the Gospel? What does Paul say is the assurance/guarantee of the Gospel?
- 6. Compare 1 Thessalonians 4:17-18 and 1 Thessalonians 5:10-11. What is similar about these verses?

7. Since we are of the day and light, what does it mean to be "awake and sober"? What does it practically look like to "armor up" with the Gospel? How do we encourage and build one another up with these Gospel truths?

- Pray that the coming wrath of God will be more real for you so that
 1) the Gospel may be more sweet to you and 2) the perilous state of not-yet-Christians might be more vivid to you.
- Share and pray for other needs in your group.
