- 4. How and in what ways did Moses give himself for God's people? What are ways we can give ourselves for God's people?

- 5. Which of the three marks of Moses and Jesus is the most challenging for you and why?
- 6. As we come to the end of NEXT, how has our NEXT vision and generosity initiative impacted you and your family? What has God taught you through this process?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Pray for those suffering through this Covid-19 pandemic and pray for the continuing recovery.
- Pray for one another's growth in Godliness along the lines of the message and in the 3 areas we highlighted together.
- Pray for one another's needs and those who need Jesus.
