Understanding Baptism

Here at Grace, we always want you to understand what we do and why we do it. Here's a brief introduction to baptism presented as answers to frequently asked questions . . .

Does baptism save a person?

No, salvation is by God's grace alone, through faith alone, in Jesus Christ alone (Eph. 2:1-10). Baptism symbolizes outwardly what has already happened inwardly when a person puts their faith in Jesus.

Who should be baptized?

Those who realize that Jesus Christ lived the life that they should be living and died the death that they deserve. Those who repent of (turn from) their sins and trust Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and the gift of eternal life.

Why should I be baptized?

- A person should be baptized because Jesus commands us to be baptized (Matthew 28:19).
- A person should be baptized to publicly proclaim their faith in Jesus Christ, so that the Church can celebrate together with them and so the world will know of our identification with Jesus Christ (Acts 8:38).

How can I be forgiven and come into a life-changing relationship with God through Jesus Christ?

Repent of (turn from) your sins and your self-reliance and put your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 16:31)! Realize that you're a great sinner, but that Jesus is a Great Savior. Repentance and faith must happen inwardly, but they can be expressed outwardly through a prayer something like this:

Lord Jesus Christ, thank you for dying for my sins, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and trust you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Who can I talk to about a relationship with God and/or baptism?

Any one of our campus staff or elders would consider it a privilege to talk with you about spiritual matters of the soul and/or baptism. We are here to serve you and desire to help any way we can. Just contact your campus staff by phone or email.

Baptism is the command of Jesus for all those who find and follow Him. It's a full and multi-dimensional picture of the Good News of salvation through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Baptism is a gift of God to help make the Gospel more real to our hearts. Here's what we learn in Titus 3:4-7.


Baptism is a picture of our NEW BIRTH: what Titus calls our REGENERATION.

1. Baptism is a reminder that we've been born again by GOD.

2. Baptism is a reminder that we've been born again by GRACE.

3. Baptism is a reminder that we've been born again to NEW LIFE.

4. Baptism is a reminder that we've been born again for ETERNAL LIFE.

Grappling with God's Word Together (about 20 min.)

What were your personal takeaways from the service? How were you touched, moved or challenged?

2. Read Titus 3:3-7 again together. This passage speaks of the "washing of regeneration." What is that? And what does it have to do with physical water baptism?

3. How does this passage remind us that our spiritual baptism (which physical baptism pictures) is the work of God alone?

4. How/where does this passage remind us that our spiritual baptism (which physical baptism pictures) is the work of grace alone? If it's a work of grace, what is it not? 5. How/where does this passage remind us that our spiritual baptism (which physical baptism pictures) is FOR a new life and new way of living? 6. How/where does this passage remind us that our spiritual baptism (which physical baptism pictures) is FOR eternal life? 7. Baptism is very much for those being baptized, but it's also for those who are watching baptism. So how did this week's baptism help make the Gospel more real to your own heart?

Praying Together (about 20 min.)

- Pray together for those baptized on Sunday that baptism might be a catalyst to galvanize and grow their faith. Pray together that many more people might be saved and baptized at Grace Central Coast.
- Pray for the deep and wide growth of Grace Central Coast as we seek to help people find and follow Jesus.
