4. How should Jesus's words in Luke 24:27, 44-46 shape how we read the Old Testament? 5. Have one person share the Gospel with the rest of your group, using the words "deliver" and "redeem" to explain what God has done for us in Christ. 6. We all struggle to faithfully listen to Jesus and all He calls us to do. Share with each other: when you stop listening to Jesus, what other voices do you start to listen to instead? 7. How could we use truths from this week's texts and message to share the hope of Jesus with those around us who don't yet know Him?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Pray for us to have a Christ-centered view of Scripture and our lives.
- Praise God for how He has redeemed and forgiven us in Christ.
- Pray for one another's needs and those who need Jesus.
