6. How gentle and lowly are you toward others — your family, neighbors, co-workers, strangers? Would people around you see you as gentle and lowly? How would they describe you?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Pray for the continued Covid recovery that is now clearly under way.
- With Matthew 11:28-30 in hand, come to Jesus praying for one another to know, believe and experience Him as gentle and lowly.
- Share burdens you carry and bear one another's burdens through prayer.
