

CONNECT (ask this question to check-in with your group)

In light of both our summer series (Ruth and Reel Grace) dealing with stories, share which stories (books, movies, short stories, etc.) have fascinated you most in your life.

DISCUSS (use some of these questions to process God's Word together)

 Read Ruth 1:1–18. Discuss how God's word impacted you this week? What were your takeaways from the message?

2. Read Luke 24:27, 44, 45 along with John 5:39 and discuss why it's so important to read the Old Testament stories with Christ in view. What are the dangers of not doing this?

3. Have one brave person in your group take a shot at retelling the overarching story of the Bible. Then have another person explain where and how the short story of Ruth fits into that larger story.

4. What is God's "hidden providence," how does it show up in the story, and why should that encourage us today?

5. Look at Galatians 3:13 & 2:12–13 and discuss how the redemption story in Ruth is meant to foreshadow our redemption in Christ.

6. After beginning our study, what excites you about the story of Ruth? What are you interested in diving into?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)

- Praise God for the redemption we have in Christ.
- Pray for eyes of faith to see God at work even when he seems hidden.
- Share physical and spiritual updates and pray for those areas of your lives.
- Pray that the summer study in Ruth would draw our church closer to the heart of God.
