3. Why does it make sense for v16 to be the application flowing from the truth of v15? Talk through how the two are connected.

4. What do you naturally think you'll find when you approach God after sinning. What does this text say you will find?

5. How does this text change how you view Jesus and His feelings toward you in your weaknesses?

6. How does this text contribute to the truth that Jesus is "gentle and lowly in heart" (Matt 11:29)?

PRAY (use these prompts to pray in response to God's Word)
