5. What do we mean when we say, "We must now understand grace and truth in light of Jesus?" Why is that true?

6. Why must an understanding of grace and truth in Jesus lead us toward following Jesus' way of grace and truth with others around us? Which one do you need to grow in? Grace? Truth?
