- 5. Your Growth Group as a Family: We are saved by grace alone. As a family of grace saved by grace, we are to share and show this grace to one another. What are practical ways you can share and show Gospel grace to one another? It's not easy, but how can we humbly express our need for daily grace with one another?
- 6. Your Growth Group as a Servant/Missionary: Why must grace make us humble and eager to share grace with others? Why then are Christians too often perceived by not-yet-Christians as prideful and self-righteous? How can we better show our own humble need for grace as we seek to share God's grace with others? Is there a current relationship in your life where someone needs to experience God's grace through you?
