4.	Do you tend to think of the mission of Jesus as a "small, short game or as a "big, long game?"
5.	What are the 4 types of fruit mentioned in John 15 and how does each relate to the mission of Jesus?
6.	Do you see your life as connected to, and fruitful in, the mission of Jesus? In what ways? (Help one another in your group see those connections!)
