 - working through HANG UPS, BARRIERS and OBSTACLES .
 - with open sharing of INSECURITIES, FEARS and DESIRES.

- 1. Sexual Intimacy is a GOOD GIFT of God.
 - Sex is God's INVENTION.
 - God's desire for us is PLEASURE and FREEDOM in this area.
- 2. Sexual Intimacy is for MARRIAGE. (SOS 2:7, 3:5, 8:4)
 - Sex is SOULISH: There is no such thing as "CASUAL SEX". (1 Cor. 6)
 - The sharing of ourselves in sex is for a WHOLE-LIFE commitment for a LIFE-TIME.
 - Sex is both for our PLEASURE and for PROCREATION.
- 3. Sexual Intimacy is about SELF-GIVING.
 - (Not SELF-SEEKNG)
 - (Not WITHHOLDING)

5. Sexual Intimacy is BROKEN.

- SOLOMON was broken in this area. (1 Ki. 11:3-4)
- WE ARE all broken in this area.

6. Sexual Intimacy is a GOSPEL ARENA. (Eph. 5:31-33)

- A place to PRACTICE and LIVE the Gospel .
- One building block of a healthy, God-honoring marriage that DISPLAYS the Gospel to a BROKEN world.
