God's Generosity Various Texts Sunday, December 6, 2020

- 5. What kind of people might we become if we can remember that God owns all and gives all? What keeps you from being more generous?
- 6. Growth Group as a FAMILY: Why do we tend to think of generosity in mostly financial terms? What are other ways we can be generous with one another? How is your group doing in being generous with one another?
- 7. Growth Group as SERVANT/MISSIONARY: Do you think the world looks at Christians as generous people? What is one way your group can practice generosity together toward the broader community this month?

- Pray for one another's open-handed, open-life generosity toward one another and toward the broader community.
- Be generous in your listening and encouragement as you share other needs and pray for one another.
