3. Christmas is EMPOWERING (Luke 1:35-38)



Gabriel's Song Luke 1:26-38 Sunday, December 9, 2018

Tim Keller notes that one of the great challenges of Christmas worship is that we go back to familiar words and familiar themes. Our hearts need to be addressed rather than lulled to sleep. Gabriel's Song definitely didn't lull Mary to sleep and this morning we will see its challenge for us today.

 Explain the two reasons why Mary was so troubled by Gabriel's greeting. Discuss how you resonate with Mary in those ways. 3. Explain how Christmas is category-shattering for Mary and for the world. What are the categories/belief systems of your neighbors, familymembers, co-workers, etc.? If you don't know, pray for opportunities to ask honoring questions and for a patient and learning heart. Pray also that God might use you and the message of Christmas to engage their hearts.

4. Explain how Mary has gone from being utterly distressed to utterly perplexed to utterly onboard? What might God be asking of you this Christmas and how does Christmas empower you to do it?
