- 2. How does Sarai's barrenness relate to the condition of humanity after the scattering at Babel? What is the author telling us? What does barrenness represent?

- 3. Abram actually has two encounters with God. Where are they in the text? How are they similar and how are they different? At what point in the narrative does each occur?
- 4. What are the 8 promises that God makes to Abram? Are they conditional or unconditional? Do they depend on Abram or on God? (It's a trick question!)

5. What are the evidences of Abram's faith? What does it mean to "call upon the name of the Lord?"
