The Last Words of Paul 2 Timothy 4:9-22

CONNECTING with One Another (30 min)

Week #2 of Growth Groups is about settling in and gelling together as a group. Take some time to share about your week and how you're doing.

EXPLORING God's Word with One Another (20 – 30 min)

- 1. Read 2 Timothy 4:9-22 again as a group. What are the concerns of this about-to-die man? What's he thinking about? What jumps out at you here?
- 2. Based on all you know about Paul, what are some words you'd use to describe him? Is he task-oriented or people-oriented? Is he a Type A personality or a Type B personality? Is he driven or carefree and relaxed? Does this text challenge any of that? If so, how? What does this text reveal about Paul?
- 3. How many names does Paul name in these verses? What does that communicate? How many references to "the Lord" or "Jesus" are there? What does that communicate?
- 4. If you were to write a final letter at the end of your life, to whom would you write? Who would you mention in your closing comments? In whose dying letter list would you be mentioned?

- 5. Paul speaks of the Lord's rescue in two senses in verses 17 and 18. Does he expect rescue from the lion's mouth once more?
- 6. Is Paul giving up and shutting down? How do we know from the text?
- 7. We often wonder what a Christ-centered life really looks like. How does this text show us and provide an answer? So, what does a Christ-centered life look like?
- 8. What was the most impactful or challenging thing you heard in this text/message? How does this text/message speak to your soul?

PRAYING for One Another (15-20 min)

Remember, this quarter we want to encourage depth of personal sharing and caring in our Growth Groups, so our goal is to pray for each other, not for everyone else in our extended circles. So, really focus on sharing and praying for one another in light of this text/message, as well as for any other requests/needs the group has. Let's let God's Word lead us to the throne of grace.



OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

- We believe the **Bible** is the inspired, inerrant, infallible word and revelation of God. It is the authoritative standard for every age and life.
- We believe there is one God, eternally existing in three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - each of whom are equal in attributes of deity.
- We believe that Jesus Christ in the flesh was both God and man; His virgin birth, His sinless life, His miracles, His death on the cross as a penalty for our sins, and His bodily resurrection from the dead on the third day; His ascension to the right hand of God as our Mediator, Priest, and Advocate.
- We believe all men have sinned and fall short of the standard of God.
- We believe that in His death, the Lord Jesus Christ made a perfect atonement for sin, redeeming us from the curse of the law. Men are saved and justified on the simple ground of His shed blood.
- We believe that salvation is by grace, through faith alone. Our hope of eternal life with Jesus Christ is entirely based upon His work and efficacy on the cross and victory over death and sin, and not upon good works, baptism or church membership.
- We believe that a true believer is eternally secure, that he cannot lose his salvation, but that sin may interrupt the joy of his fellowship with God and bring loving discipline from his Heavenly Father.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit is a person, is God and possesses all the divine attributes. He indwells all believers, baptizes and seals them at the moment of their salvation, and fills them in response to confession of sin and yieldedness.
- We believe in the reality of **Satan**.
- We believe that the church is made up of those who have individually trusted Christ as their Savior and Lord and have bound themselves together to proclaim God's grace in their lives and to share that good news with others. As believers, we are admonished to regularly assemble together.
- We believe in the blessed hope of the believer that we will be with Christ for all eternity - and eternal punishment for all those who do not believe in the Lord Jesus Christ.
